NOCTI

NOCTI is the National Occupational Competency Testing Institute. Senior completer students must take the comprehensive exam during the spring of their senior year. The test has two components, a performance and technical assessment. Students must successfully complete both parts in order to receive a PA Skills Certificate and be a Program Completer

National Technical Honor Society

The National Technical Honor Society is an educational non-profit that exists to honor, recognize, and empower students and teachers in Career & Technical Education. As the honor society for Career & Technical Education, NTHS serves over 100,000 active members annually in both secondary and postsecondary chapters across the country.

Free College Credits

Increasing numbers of high school technical courses are linked to two-year college programs. These programs can give you a head start on college and prepare you for jobs offering some of the greatest career opportunities for the future.

Articulation Agreement/SOAR

A Career and Technical Education (CTE) Articulation Agreement is an agreement written between two institutions that permit skills and tasks learned at one institution (in this case, Forbes Road Career and Technology Center, which offers the PDE Approved SOAR Program) to be accepted and applied toward a degree or certificate at a postsecondary institution. Statewide articulation occurs when a specific Perkins Allocated Postsecondary Institution agrees to award college credit opportunities to any qualifying graduate of a PDE approved secondary school offering the SOAR Programs of Study across the entire Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, hence a statewide articulation.

For Eligibility Requirements, students must:

- Earn a high school diploma, achieve a minimum 2.5 GPA in the technical courses and complete the secondary school component of the approved PDE Program of Study
- Achieve competent or advanced level on the Secondary School end-ofprogram assessment that is appropriate to the approved PDE Program of Study.
- Achieve proficiency on all of the approved PDE Program of Study Secondary Competency Task List
- Furnish documentation to Postsecondary Institution upon written request.

In addition, FRCTC has a number of direct college credit articulation agreements with many post-secondary institutions.

Resources

Forbes Road CTC has two Resource Rooms that are staffed by certified special education teachers. Any student that needs help with their academic and /or technical work can go to the Resource Room for help. The staff also provides accommodations for testing.

Student Assistant Program (SAP)

The Student Assistance Program at FRCTC helps to identify students who are experiencing problems that are interfering with their success. The SAP team helps students remove barriers that may be interfering with schoolwork and their overall wellbeing. The SAP team consists of general ed teachers, special ed teachers, counselors, administrators, and outside agencies. Students can be referred to the SAP team through someone at school, families, friends, or students can refer themselves! Negative symptoms that could lead to a SAP referral include: poor academic performance, showing disinterest in school, poor attendance, mental/emotional distress, loss of a loved one, trouble with the law and/or drug/alcohol use. School to Work

100% of students can gain real-world experience while in high school through Co-Ops, Job Shadows, Internships, and Apprenticeships.

Cooperative Education (Co-Op)

This is a method of instruction of technical education for individuals who, through written cooperative arrangements (Training Agreement and Training Plan)between the schools (FRCTC and home school), employers, parents/guardians, and the students. Students will "cap off" their training and receive instruction by integrating academic and technical instruction with job training in their career field. The paid training experience must be planned and supervised by Forbes Road CTC and employers to enhance the students' education and employability. Students will attend their home school for academics Monday-Friday in the am. During the PM, students will attend FRCTC Monday-Tuesday-Friday and work Wednesday-Thursday.

Academics: Students must take the required academic classes through their home school.

Internships

Eleventh and twelfth-grade students in our technical programs may have the opportunity to be involved with various local employers at an off-campus worksite. An Internship is a maximum of one-semester unpaid work experience.

Job Shadow

Tenth and eleventh-grade students are highly encouraged to spend one to three days total, at a worksite directly related to their chosen career and technical field. The purposes of such visitations are to gain insight into the real-world of work. These first-hand experiences provide the tools, products, and talents of personnel within their desired career pathway through the sponsoring business.

Student Organizations

Students that join Student Organizations have the opportunity to participate in any or all of the following as it pertains to their technical class.

SkillsUSA is a student organization that is very active at Forbes.

It is a national student organization solely for students in technical, skilled, and service careers. Students involved in SkillsUSA develop technical, academic, employability and leadership skills. Students get involved in community service projects, competitions, leadership conferences and fundraisers.
